Women's leadership and political participation

+7 LAC countries approved quota or parity measures, resulting in 18 of 33 LAC countries with some affirmative measures

+8 countries advanced on normative measures for the eradication of VAW in Politics (totaling 10 in the region)

Political Parity Index in +7 countries reaching 13 LAC countries with data, analysis and recommendations towards parity


Virtual Platform for Political Training: 3323 women in politics strengthened

Indigenous and Afro-Descendant women's political rights and leadership strengthened (country examples)

- High-level Indigenous Women's Platform in Guatemala
- Inclusion of UN Women Originarias programme leaders in the Constitutional Cabinet of Chile
- First national network of Afro and Aymara Municipal Women Leaders in Bolivia
- Mainstreamed the focus of Indigenous and Quilombola Women into subnational public policies and procedures in Brazil
- Key documents on VAWP and WPP in indigenous languages and close work with indigenous authorities in Mexico



11 LAC countries are designing or starting to implement National Care Systems with UN Women support

Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Mexico, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay

- Care positioned as a key for COVID-19 recovery and sustainable recovery regionally, national and local levels and advancing in 11 countries with UNW support
- Regional consensus to position Care Societies as the main theme for the XV LAC Regional Conference on Women in 2022
- Evidence generation (e.g., retrospective study to quantify the costs and benefits of subsidized childcare in Barbados)
- Law reforms promoted to set foundations for care systems (e.g., Mexico)
- Financing for care boosted by UN Women costing methodology

The creation of the Guarantee Fund, accompanied by technical assistance and financing from MELYT, has increased the availability of financing for guarantees for US\$1 million under the "Financial Sector Support Facility for financing Micro, Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises affected by the crisis generated by COVID-19" implemented by Central American Integration Bank with a total amount of US\$650 million.




