Excellencies, Distinguished Colleagues,

We have managed to accomplish much in our first in-person meeting of the Board in 2 years. You will all agree that there's no substitute to meeting in person to have interactive discussions.

I congratulate you for the consensus adoption of the 4 decisions, namely:

- Annual Report of the Under-Secretary-General/Executive Director;
- Report on the evaluation function;
- Report on internal audit and investigation activities, and
- On the repositioning of the United Nations Development System.

I thank the delegations of Argentina, Iceland, the Republic of Korea and Sierra Leone for their very skillful facilitation of these important decisions. The experts deserve our sincere appreciation for their tireless work over the past weeks. I am aware that this was no easy feat, and your hard work is truly appreciated. I also thank all Member States for their constructive engagement and flexibility. Thank you!

Excellencies,

At the opening of the session, the Executive Director presented the results that UN-Women was able to achieve during 2021. She stressed the importance of close collaboration with sister agencies and the need for UN-Women to not just participate in UN reform processes, but lead from within. I couldn't agree more with her. UN-Women has a critical, central role to play in ensuring that a gender perspective is mainstreamed in all our work, policies and actions.

Madam Executive Director, we welcome your commitment to continue strengthening UN-Women's financial management, risk management, and ethics functions. We particularly appreciate your announcement to establish a dedicated ethics function within UN-Women. You will have the full support of the Board in your important initiatives. The women of the world need a strong and impactful UN-Women.

Distinguished Colleagues,

At yesterday's opening segment, we heard interventions from 33 Member States, including regional and other cross-regional group statements. The presence of a high number of ambassadors shows the importance they attach to UN-Women, and their strong support to the organization, especially for the implementation of the current Strategic Plan. This is very reassuring. We also heard member states emphasize the importance and value of UN-Women's coordination mandate, especially in the field and reiterated their call for multi-

stakeholder partnership in tackling the ongoing challenges to women's rights and gender equality.

We heard about the challenges that lie ahead in meeting the SDGs; and that women continue to face injustice and discrimination globally, worsened now by the triple-C crises of conflict, climate and the COVID 19-pandemic.

In situations of ongoing conflicts and humanitarian emergencies, we call for UN Women's stronger leadership in implementing the WPS agenda. The upcoming Transforming Education Summit will also offer an opportunity to address existing gender gaps in education and digital inclusion.

We also heard strong support for UN Women's efforts to broaden the base of funding and partnership. In all such efforts, it is important that the organization is mindful of national priorities and ownership. As we emphasize on more gender actions, we must match that gender financing.

I am aware of the critical role that UN-Women colleagues at the frontline play.
I pay my tribute to them – for their courage, conviction and commitment, often working under challenging situations – they are the true gender champions. Thank you!

As you are aware, I expect to soon assume the position of the High Representative of the UN Secretary General for the LDCs, LLDCs and SIDs. It has been an absolute honour and privilege for me to lead the UN-Women Executive Board since January this year; and to be able to play my humble part to support UN-Women's mission to ensure "Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women" across the world. As a self-declared 'gender champion and activist', this experience will always be very special; it will remain an inspiration for me to continue to pursue an agenda for more dignified, and more empowered, lives and livelihoods for women everywhere, especially for those who are the furthest behind.

I wish to take this opportunity to say that it was such a pleasure to work with the new Executive Director, my dear friend Sima – we started this journey with UN-Women together. Within a very short period of time, she has brought in so much energy and dynamism to the work of UN-Women. As someone who has been dealing with women's issues for the most part of her professional life – I was also part of the diehard Beijing experts from here - I can say that we have made a lot of progress to place women's issues high on the multilateral and national agendas. Yet we are still far from creating a world where women and men have equal opportunities in every sphere of their lives. There are still many artificial glass ceilings, socio-economic bottlenecks, and

gender-stereotypical attitudes both within and across our societies, which comes in the way of realizing women's full potentials—both politically and economically.

And here, UN-Women has such an important role to play to help to overcome these challenges and carry forward a transformative journey to create equal opportunities and futures for all women and girls. It needs to champion innovative and real-time solutions to the most pressing challenges facing women –from women's political and economic empowerment and equal rights to eliminating gender divides.

Although I am leaving the presidency of the UN-Women Executive Board, I will be very much in the system. So, I will keep looking for ways to work with UN-Women, especially in tackling the unique challenges faced by women in LDCs, LLDCs and SIDs.
