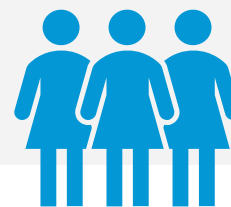

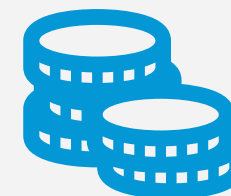

## Internal Preparedness

- Programme Development**
  - Support crisis affected COs to upscale their humanitarian and DRR work
- Strengthen Regional Surge Capacities**
  - Establish Talent pool/surge capacities to support countries in crisis
- Humanitarian Cluster**
  - Strengthen UN Women's engagement humanitarian and DRR work post IASC admission
- Funding Mechanisms**
  - Establishment of regional humanitarian kitty, increase multi-country RM efforts

## Support to Partners

- Women & Youth Organizations**
  - Strengthen their knowledge , skills to influence HA
- GiHA Capacities**
  - Strengthen humanitarian stakeholders for Gender Mainstreaming
- GiHA Coordination**
  - Coordinating GM efforts across the humanitarian actors
- Strategic Partnerships**
  - Strengthen regional level partnerships for humanitarian and DRR work
- Gender Data**
  - Support gender analysis and provision of data to strengthen gender integration regionally
