Context

Complex Operating Environment

- Post-COVID19 economic downturns, reduction/redirection of development financing
- Increased frequency & intensity of climate related events & disasters: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Nepal, Tonga, Vanuatu.
- Complex emergencies & contexts impacting the geopolitical landscape & economic recovery: Afghanistan, Iran, Myanmar.
- Shifting political landscapes: Elections in program countries Bangladesh, India, Indonesia, Pakistan, Republic of Korea, Sri Lanka, Solomon Islands

Situation of Women & Girls

- Representation of women in leadership, politics & decision-making among the lowest in the world
- Female labor force participation rates (FLFS) declined by approx. 10% between 1990 & 2021, stands at 48.5% (MLFS- 83.4%).
- 52.64% of inactive women of working age cited unpaid care responsibilities as one of the main reasons for staying out of the labor force.
- Higher prevalence than the global average (27%) of Intimate Partner Violence, with sub regional variations.

- Resilience of Lives and Livelihoods
- Meeting the needs of women and girls in humanitarian/ crisis contexts.
- Enhancing <u>coordination</u> through GiHA Working Group and IBC on Resilience.

Countries include: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Fiji and Pacific, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines

Ending VAWG

- National Action Plans on Ending VAW
- Access to protection, services, education and economic opportunities.
- Safe and fair migration
- Social Norm Change
- Enhancing coordination through the UNITE Working Group.

Key results in 2022-2024

Gender and Climate

- Promoted gender mainstreaming in climate action: Gender-inclusive NDCs & CCGAPs.
- Conducted 2 national surveys on gender-environment (Tonga and Samoa)
- Explored connections between VAW and Disasters.

Women's Economic Empowerment

- Advanced the decent work agenda: policies, standards & practices.
- Advanced private sector engagement in WEE: 2,406 total WEPs signatories/ impacting 5.2 million employees
- Improved women's skills, income opportunities and market access

Ending VAWG

- Strengthened VAW prevention and response: 6 Action Plans on VAWG and trafficking adopted (4 National Action Plans, 1 Local Action Plan, 1 Regional Action Plan)
- Enhanced national and regional institutional capabilities on VAW: 21,953 key stakeholders equipped & providing services to VAW survivors.

Coordination

- Strengthened UN coordination in humanitarian/crisis contexts: expanded to Afghanistan, Myanmar, Pakistan, Bangladesh, the Philippines
- Regional UN coordination group on WPS
- Enhanced programming results across thematic areas through joint work/programmes with other UN agencies.
- Advanced GEWE in intergovernmental normative processes: CSW, BPfA.

Inclusive Governance and WPS

- Advanced National Action Plans on WPS: 2 NAPs on Women, Peace and Security adopted (Philippines and Sri Lanka).
- Supported WPS Agenda Localisation: In 6 countries (Cambodia, Indonesia, Philippines, Thailand, Viet Nam and Timor-Leste).
- Facilitated increased commitment to women's leadership and political participation: AIPA General Assembly 44 Resolution on Enhancing ASEAN Resilience through Women's Leadership and Gender-Responsive Parliaments

- Prevention Hub to advance social norms change and protocols for systematically handling cases of gender-based violence

- Livelihood/economic security/care across humanitarian, peace, development nexus
- Advance corporate Economic Empowerment Strategy, contextualized
- Inclusive Governance and WPS including stock-taking during 25th Anniversary of UNSCR 1325 (2025)
